Works are still ongoing at Site C, and although we have been slightly delayed by the utility companies carrying out pipe laying and engineering works, we are heading towards completion of this phase and look forward to the day when the new homes are open to residents in the Spring.

30 new affordable homes at Ockford Ridge near completion

The fourth phase of the regeneration of Ockford Ridge, Site C, being delivered by leading local house builder Thakeham is nearing completion. Site C comprises 18 houses and 12 flats for social, affordable rent and shared ownership and the last of the properties should be finished next Spring.

All of the homes will be net zero carbon in operation, with solar panels and air source heat pumps providing renewable energy to heat and light the homes. Swift bricks and bat boxes are being installed on many of the houses, along with hedgehog highways (holes in fences) to give nature a helping hand.

The last big piece of work is by Thames Water who will be connecting the water and drains. Some residents will be affected by these works. Separate letters have been sent to you, if it affects access to your home for a short period of time.

Welcoming Niblock to the Ridge

Work has begun on the seven retrofit properties on the Ridge, with the sites secured and the initial stripping out being completed. These works will continue to make progress over the next few months, incorporating the addition of external wall insulation, new windows and doors, solar panels, air source heat pumps, new electrical installations, and revised interiors. Completion of the works is expected next year.

Niblock is keen to add benefit to the local community through their recent involvement with the community garden, engagement with St Mark and All Saints Primary School, and donations to support local initiatives such as the Surrey SATRO Mentoring Programme.

Eddie & Ellie's Wild Adventures is Thakeham's award winning programme for primary school pupils to learn about ecology & biodiversity in a fun way. Following the summer update on our storyboarding and Surrey Wildlife Trustday trip, we are delighted to have continued working with St Mark and All Saints Primary to deliver the programme.

The children in year 3 have been to visit Ockford Ridge Site C, where they learnt not only about construction, but also local wildlife and how we are supporting this at the new development. We talked about the swift bricks, bat boxes, hedgehog holes and pollinator friendly planting at the scheme, as well as having a fun wildlife fact game to boost their know how of the local wildlife. In addition, we have delivered a 3Rs, Reduce, Reuse, Recycle, poster workshop in school this term to help support pupils understanding of this important sustainability topic. Their designs were fantastic!

Waverley Borough Council is delighted to see schemes like this in action in the borough, helping to support delivery of their wider biodiversity policy.
