We're especially keen that the development of Ockford Ridge is completed as soon as possible, not only because of our duty to our residents, but because it's always a joyous occasion to provide homes like these to people that need them in our community!

More new homes underway despite the snow!

As reported in our Summer Edition of MyOckford Ridge, Thakeham Homes were chosen as our preferred contractor and the council have entered into contract with them for the next phase of development. The agreement with Thakeham is to deliver 18 houses and 12 new flats for affordable rent, including a number of shared ownership homes. Foundation works are ongoing, with timber frames starting to be delivered in January 2023 and brickwork commencing February 2023.

More success from SATRO

Waverley's Community Development Officer, Kate Douglas reports on more good work funded through the community benefit programme at Ockford Ridge.

The Covid Pandemic was difficult for everyone, but children and young people have been particularly affected. Young people have missed out on opportunities to learn and socialise with others and often their confidence and certainty in the future has been shaken.

We're very pleased with the work that SATRO, a local education charity, has been doing with local schools to mentor students who can benefit from the type of support they offer.

Mo Forgan from SATRO said: **"We work with students who are most likely to benefit from a 'critical friend', a mentor, who can listen to them, allow them to talk about their plans and hopes, and then help them come up with their own solutions. Mentoring support helps young people think about their futures and make good choices."**

Kerry Wilson, Mentor programme coordinator at Rodborough School said: **"Students have benefitted from improved organisational skills, confidence in speaking to adults, help with deciding on their work experience, setting their aims for the future, and generally having a neutral adult who takes an individual interest in them who they can talk to."**

The Waverley/Rodborough programme started its second year in September 2022 and will be expanding this year.

Laurel Close's summer sign off

The official opening of Site B (Laurel close) was held earlier this year over the summer. Its completion brings to a close the second site completed on the Ockford Ridge regeneration programme by Thakeham Homes. This development delivered 17 modern, high quality affordable homes for residents of Waverley.



Planting strong roots in our community

Eashing Cemetery Community Garden and Orchard is a joint initiative between Waverley Borough Council, Godalming Town Council, Thakeham, COPSE Community Orchard Project South East and Roots for the Future. The garden and orchard symbolise the wider regeneration of the estate and how all the partners are working together to help to create a stronger, lasting sense of community for residents and their visitors alike. Through this project, we can all enjoy the new trees, wildflowers and the Garden in the cemetery.

Since the launch, there have been monthly Saturday community days and opportunities to meet on Wednesday evenings every other week. The local schools, Brownies, Guides, Rainbows, Cubs, corporate teams have all been digging in!

A line of 12 Walnut Trees, donated by Thakeham, through the community benefit programme were planted on 26th November by volunteers and partners. Representatives from the Muslim Community gave advice and guidance on appropriate fruit trees to plant on the Muslim Burial Area. There was also a drawing competition, with children getting the opportunity to help us design the garden's logo too! There were some lovely entries which will be displayed on a new banner.
