



## Planning appeal

The SHAOB is solely concerned with the 'natural' environment and no development can enhance it. *Unacceptable outcomes*

The visual character of the A286 as a sunken country lane irrevocably changed by site entrance and necessity of tree felling

Footpath 597 would suffer a similar fate:

Only footpath from south into Haslemere town for that part of the road ( dangerous to walk on road)

Safe and pleasant path views of sloping meadow and trees

Post build would be views of roads, vehicles and properties

Path cut in half to create access road, lodge etc


I've been using this footpath since 2000, it's how I get to Camelsdale and go on walks.

I regularly walk ( often with a dog or grandchildren) and enjoy the innumerable footpaths that circle and access Blackdown and can vary my walks frequently. There is no need for further footpaths over the land in question.
